It feels like the sunshine has been a long time coming this year, with the cold winds and rain lasting far longer than usual! Luckily however, there's no shortage of warming community spirit in our locality, as shown by this edition's articles about the recent Christian Aid funds raised; the support available to elderly folk through a home-sharing scheme; grants available to young people in education; and the plethora of clubs, special interest groups, events and activities available to all. SHARE HOME SCHEME BRINGS ELDERLY TOGETHER

Life can be difficult as you get older, particularly if you find yourself living alone for the first time. Having seen how hard it can be for her own parents, Clifton resident Liz Davis started a local community organisation with her family to provide an alternative that could help. It partners with the local authority, NHS and local charities and has been highlighted by BBC Hereford and Worcester.

The non-profit-making scheme brings older people together to share company at home, providing regular professional support and shared living costs. It works by connecting homeowners who have a spare room with similar-aged renters who are looking for supported accommodation. "Many people find themselves living alone in a house now too big for them and costly to maintain, but wouldn't want to move out from the home and community they love," explained Liz (pictured below, with her mum). "They worry that they will need more support in the future. Sharing a home with someone you get on well with can bring company, support and lower bills. The Share Home organisation manages everything on behalf of both sharers, providing safeguarding throughout the sharing and helping with any future choices."

The scheme started in Gloucestershire in 2021 and has made a big difference to sharers' lives, wellbeing and happiness, said Liz. "Typical comments from sharers include, 'It can give you confidence and encourage you to do something' and 'We don't put any pressure on each other. We can do whatever we want'. Sharing a meal, watching TV together and having someone to go out with again, can bring back normality and some fun in life."

APPLY IN JULY FOR SHELSLEYS' EDUCATIONAL GRANTS

SHELSLEY WATER MILL WELCOMES 300 AT OPEN WEEKEND

The historic Shelsley Watermill welcomed around 300 visitors during its open weekend of 8 and 9 June, which offered a nostalgic look back into the way things once were in the Teme Valley.



Trustee of the Shelsley Watermill Society David Haggerty told *Teme Triangle*: "This was the first open weekend to feature demonstrations of milling since the major restoration work to replace the great spur gear and mill stones.

"Visitors were able to witness milling of some Yeomans Organic wheat from a local source into fine bread-making flour, that some of them were able to take away on the day. Unfortunately, due to a rather too enthusiastic session of milling on Saturday morning, the mill pond ran dry and the operation of the mill had to be suspended for two hours while the water level was restored! But thankfully this situation did not repeat on Sunday."

After visiting the Watermill and neighbouring St. Andrew's Church, many visitors enjoyed a refreshing cup of tea and home made cake. They were also able to view a number of classic vehicles arranged across the site, including Adam Marriot's Fowler steam traction engine, a vintage taxi, and – a firm favourite with the younger visitors – Postman Pat's mail van. The taxi was put to good use conducting rides up to the mill and back. "We thank the owners for loaning their vehicles for display over the weekend, and all of the visitors for their support. We look forward to seeing many again next year!" added David.

I am writing this while watching the ceremony to commemorate the D-Day landings on 6 June 1944. The sun is shining and it is a brilliant blue sky. How different from that day in 1944. It is a very emotional occasion and many people look rather overwhelmed, even the great and the good. It is wonderful to see so many veterans there, some in their 100s, some in their 90s, but all able to share the day. This may well be the last such ceremony as they are surely the last to survive.

I was five years old in 1944 and seem to remember my father straining to hear the news on the radio and talking to me about it. We always discussed these events and of course I had not known any other time but wartime. Sometime in that year, I also remember my little school friends, with our teacher, standing on the edge of the road near Upton upon Severn bridge, waiting for someone unknown to pass by. Eventually, a large, impressive old car came by bearing King George VI and Queen Elizabeth, who rolled their window down to wave to us. Apparently, it had been a (secret?) visit, to thank the RRE (Royal Radar Establishment) at Malvern linked to the D-Day landings.

Well, summer has disappeared again after the brief hot spell in May, but at least there is a little less rain. The weather was actually quite good during the busy Christian Aid week and every event was very successful. (For total amount raised see Page 18). The cream tea held at St Bartholomew's was particularly enjoyable as we were able sit in the sun to eat our lovely scones, jam and cream and have cups of tea or coffee, or glasses of prosecco. The amount raised is to be shared between the church and Christian Aid. Thanks to everyone who helped and to the great cooks, Dot Millward, Sue Rigby, Angela Dallow and Pat Savage. My apologies if I have missed anyone.

The final Christian Aid event at St Bartholomew's was the special circle service on 26 May with an excellent speaker, Michael Llewellyn-Jones, who told us of his service for them in Burundi. I might add that as a woman, I would not wish to live there, although hopefully conditions will change eventually, maybe because of their help.

Among the events due to take place in July and August are the special service at the Old Church at Lower Sapey on 25 August with a speaker, the probable return of a section of the famous Bach Choir, and on 8 September, the Big Breakfast at St Bartholomew's - which I think will be our 11th! ST KENELM'S WARM WELCOME SUCCESS CONTINUES

St Kenelm's Warm Welcome has continued with great success through 2023-4. From November to end of June this takes place every Thursday 10.30am-1pm in the Village Hall, providing a light lunch for between 25 to 40 people – initially soup and a roll plus plenty of cake, but more recently baked potatoes and savoury traybakes on certain weeks. Special Easter and Christmas meals have been provided where around 50 meals were served, thanks to the hard work of volunteers.

The toddler group, part of Warm Welcome, is also well established due to the hard work of Lisa and Tabitha. This uses the main hall for play and activities, providing a chance for parents and children to meet.

The Warm Welcome continues to provide a social point for young and old in the village, as well as a place to meet for those new to the village, or with health issues and less able to travel. This year it has also been supported with monthly visits from Citizens Advice Bureau and Malvern Mental Health Team.

If you have an issue that the CAB or Mental Health team can help with, this is a good point of contact.



TEME VALLEY WILDLIFE – SUMMER MOTHS & RED SQUIRRELS

On the way to visit some neighbours recently, I noticed an attractive plant with white flowers spilling out onto the side of the lane, and was startled to see a group of large, hairy, black caterpillars munching their way through the leaves. The caterpillars, which sported bright yellow stripes and white dots (photo below) were unfamiliar to me. Thankfully, my neighbours had noticed them in their own garden, first as tiny specimens in the winter, growing over the spring, then pupating and finally emerging as Scarlet Tiger moths. These colourful insects have become increasingly common and are on the wing during the day in July.

In the West Midlands six different tiger moth species have been recorded, but the Ruby Tiger (largely red in colour) and Scarlet Tiger moths (black forewings with white and cream spots and red underwings with black spots) are the most common. I shall be on the lookout for one these handsome creatures.



The Scarlet Tiger moth was first noted in the Wye Valley, then recorded in the Malvern Hills in 1973. It has gradually moved north and west, where it seeks out comfrey, green alkanet, hemp-agrimony and nettle as its caterpillar food plant. Wild comfrey, which grows in damp places, is a tallish perennial plant with hairy oval leaves and strings of purple, pink or cream flowers. Clumps of the leaves soaked in water can be turned into a useful liquid feed for the garden. Perhaps

the rise of comfrey-growing has helped to spread the Scarlet Tiger. Other plants handy to attract moths to your garden are rosebay willowherb and fuchsia for the Elephant Hawk-moth, foxgloves for the Foxglove Pug, verbascums for the Mullein moth, and marjoram and mint for the Small Purple and Gold moth. Don't forget, though, that they will make holes in your plants!

On a different subject altogether, I took part in a walk around Little Hereford (west of Tenbury) in May and a participant spotted a red squirrel. These animals are more common there, so hopefully this was a genuine sighting. Do keep your eyes peeled in case this lovely mammal has returned to the Teme Valley!

The next meeting of the Teme Valley Wildlife Group is at 7:30pm on Thursday 11 July at Stoke Bliss and Kyre Village Hall, WR15 8RR when Phil Playford will give a talk on bats. CLIFTON WI UPDATE





CLIFTON-UPON-TEME PARISH COUNCIL

Minutes of the annual meeting held 16th May 2024 at Clifton upon Teme Village Hall at 7.40pm

Present: J. Bowden (Chair); R. Neave; L. Merrick; S. Haywood, P. Brooks.

Also present: District Councillors Paul & Pam Cumming, Sarah Simcock (Clerk) and x 15 members of the Public.

1.24 Election of Chairman: Councillor John Bowden was re-elected as Chairman – unanimous decision.

2.24 Apologies: County Cllr D. Chambers; Cllr B. Gilbert (Vice-Chair).

3.24 Resignations and Co-options: None.

4.24 Election of Vice Chairman: Cllr Bruce Gilbert was re-elected – proposed Cllr Bowden, seconded Cllr Brooks. All agreed.

5.24 Declarations of Interests / Councillor Dispensations: None – Councillors were reminded to update their registers of interests. Clerk to circulate.

DEMOCRATIC PUBLIC TIME:

Residents attended the meeting to raise their concerns about land surveying at The View and Winnington Close by Terrastregic. The Chairman read out their development specification to the meeting. The land is outside the settlement boundary but is adjacent to it. The meeting noted the Neighbourhood Development Plan in place and this scheme is outside of this Plan. The Plan is the legal document for the parish.

Cllr Paul Cumming also explained the planning policy provision for the parish and MHDC. This scheme is outside the settlement boundary. SWDP remains 4 years late currently and is being worked on by a Joint Advisory Panel across the 3 districts. Current issues include the transport survey which remains outstanding. Land supply issues also remain outstanding at district level. The NDP becomes the valid local plan if it is current. Cllr Cumming is chasing his concerns with the Leader of the Council. No planning application or specific detail has been received by Terrastregic or the landowner so far but if one is submitted then the NDP policies will be considered against it.

The meeting agreed that MHDC must be held accountable for the lack of progress with land supply and SWDP and Cllr Cumming is actively pursuing this.

ACTION: Cllr Bowden agreed to action sending the letter to the landowner as agreed at the March meeting to query recent surveys and herbicides applied.

Cllr Brooks requested that our NDP is reviewed again to make sure that the Plan is valid should an application be received in the future. External Planning Consultant to be involved? Cllr Paul Cumming also to assist with this. Cllr Bowden to look into who was used when the NDP was put together – Kirkwells? The NDP must be revalidated at MHDC level and must be within 5 years. Important to note timeframes with this against the SWDP timetable.

ACTION: CIIr Bowden to contact Kirkwells re validating the current NDP.

Cllr Merrick reported that the Government has recently updated regarding environmental matters on new sites including biodiversity and species protection. Cllr Brooks said that this has been happening on this site recently. We need to look into this properly and speak with the landowner. Fields have been sprayed with herbicides which has raised real concern regarding wildlife and watercourses. The Abberley NDP might be a useful reference doc. and Cllr Bowden will obtain a copy.

Cllr Bowden asked everyone to write to MHDC with their views should any future application that be received. Information on planning policy can be found on the MHDC website if residents need to access this information.

Cllr Paul Cumming reported on current parish / district housing allocations within the SWDP. The PC asked for a written summary of the current situation for circulation. Martley figs would also be useful for this. Cllr Brooks also asked for clarification of parish boundaries / settlement boundary.

6.24 To note Standing Orders and consider any revisions: Noted.

7.24 To note the Councillor Code of Conduct: Noted.

8.24 Schemes of Delegation / Working Groups appointed:

- Urgent Business Committee approved as Cllrs Bowden, Gilbert and Brooks.
- Financial Working Group approved as Cllrs Bowden, Gilbert and Brooks.

9.24 Review of Financial regulations / Risk assessments/ Insurance policy: All docs have been circulated and are in place. Financial Regs to be reviewed at the next meeting — Clerk to circulate.

10.24 PC roles appointed:

• Banking signatories - Cllrs Bowden, Gilbert and Brooks - all agreed.

11.24 Approval of the Minutes from 11th April 2024 / matters arising: It was agreed that the Clerk represent the PC.

12.24 Minutes of the meeting held 11th April 2024: Proposed Cllr Neave, seconded Cllr Bowden, all agreed.

13.24 County & District Councillor Reports: District as circulated. No county report.

14.24 Finance & Governance Matters:

14.24.01 Payments and receipts schedule – as circulated plus additional payments reported. Unanimously agreed.


